“Love your enemies”



The Law of Talon, an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, seems barbaric to us today, in the light of the gospel of love, mercy and forgiveness. But when it was introduced it seemed like an advance—only one person being hurt or maimed or killed rather than the decimation of entire families and tribes demanded by the honour system of the times. Jesus is asking us for an advance today. He continues to encourage us to stretch far beyond our humanness, past the desire for revenge when we are hurt, past the demands of our angry hearts and egos to offering ‘no resistance’ to those who harm us. To give to those in need more than they are asking for. For sacrificial giving, giving that costs, for love of the other. The ‘wisdom of this world’ sometimes encourages us to be angry or selfish. This is, as our Second reading puts it, ‘foolishness to God.’ The God of Love knows that what the world *really needs* is love. And love starts with us, with one person having the grace to move beyond themselves, to answer the call of God to love our neighbour. Such grace comes from humility, from the recognition that we have been forgiven much: ‘He does not treat us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our faults.’ We give thanks to God for His endless compassion and mercy.
